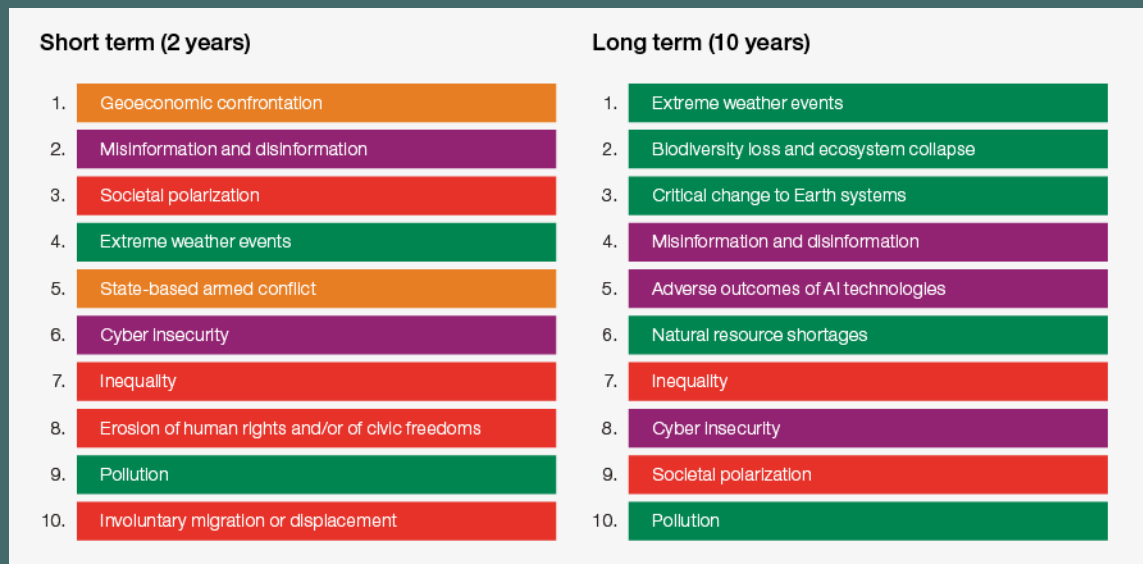

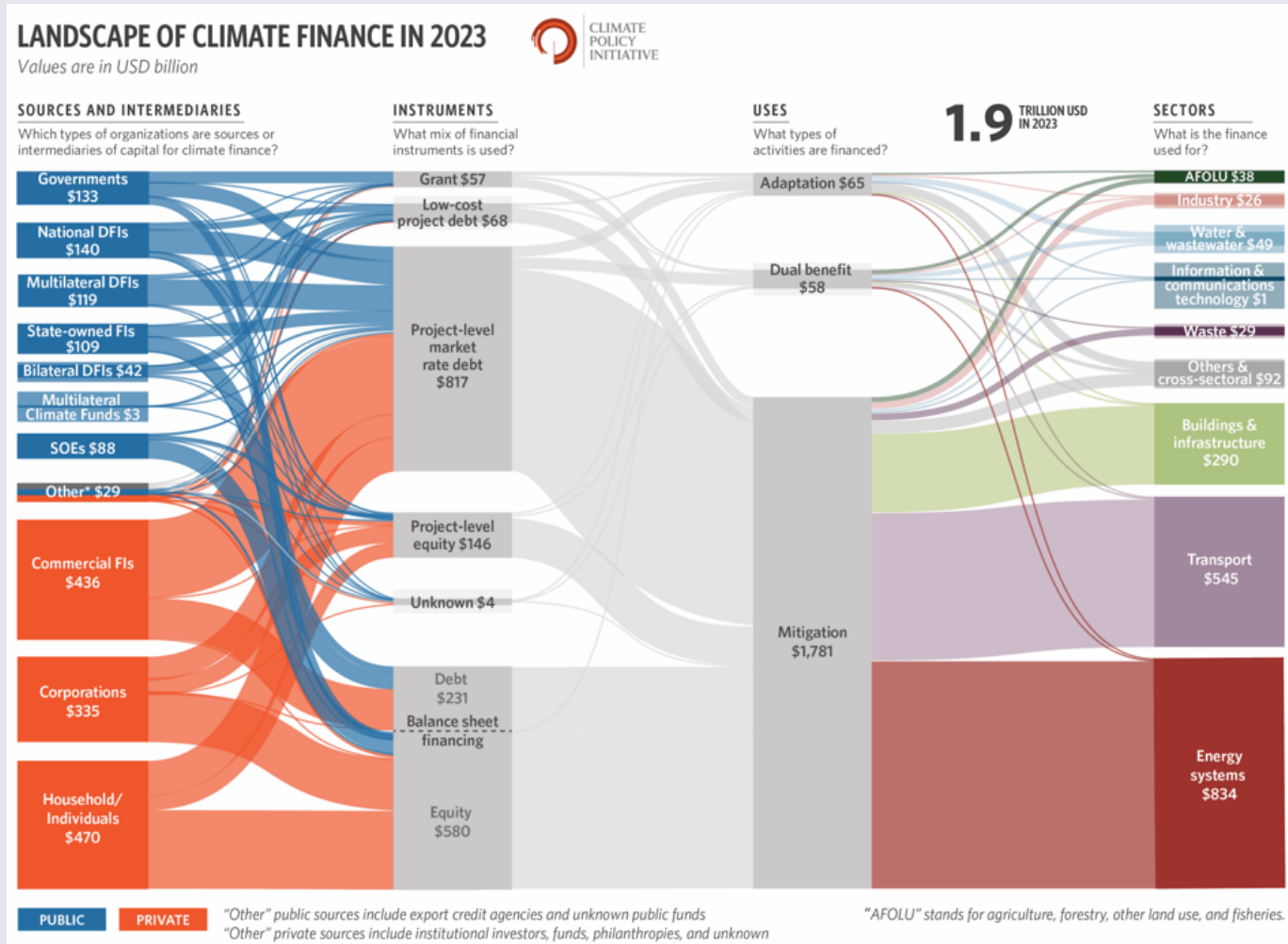
The global losses from natural disasters

Overall losses (in US\$ bn)	224	368	302	266	192
Insured losses (in US\$ bn)	108	147	125	107	66
Fatalities	17,200	11,000	23,400	17,800	41,900

A significant portion of the losses remain uninsured, consequences fall directly on governments, communities, and individuals.
